Mixed media artwork is made by using a range of materials. An example could be drawing with ink, painting over it with watercolours, then add

some highlights in coloured pencil.



The most common (artistic) media include:

- Acrylics
- Watercolour
- Ink
- Pastels
- Coloured pencils
- Watercolour pencils
- Permanent markers
- Brush pens

This is the colour wheel. Red, orange and yellow are called warm colours and purple, blue and green are called cool colours.
